First published in 1981 in the wake of the Sandinista National Liberation Front (FSLN) revolution in Nicaragua, *Sandino's Daughters* can now be seen not as a triumph of revolutionary ideals, but as a triumph of the spirit. Through a series of interviews with participants at all levels in the resistance, Margaret Randall recounts the lives of ordinary women who became pillars of strength and perseverance during their decades-long involvement in the Sandinista struggle against the Somoza dictatorship. Believing firmly that women's liberation was inextricably linked with national liberation, many of these women were in the vanguard of the movement inspired by Augusto Sandino. At the peak of revolutionary activity, women from all classes and backgrounds comprised 30 percent of the Sandinista army. For many of these women, politics became one with the personal. Hindsight perhaps offers the greatest irony of the women's alliance with the FSLN in the fact that it was a woman, Violeta Chamorro, who challenged and defeated the Sandinistas in the free elections of 1990. Though lured by the revolutionary quixotism of a promise that lasted slightly more than a decade, the women of *Sandino's Daughters* will stand as a monument to all those who yearn to be free.

Hasta La Vista Patriarchy. Feminist Science Fiction and the Exclusion of Men

feminism. In times where Science Fiction is derided and 'nerdy' we need to beam it back into the academic context. In times where utopia is almost an obscene swearword we need to put it back into perspective. What else are we supposed to imagine other than the utopian? Is there really no alternative to ecological crisis, to femicide, poverty and inequality? Of course there is, because all it needs is our imagination. If we imagine something different, this is the alternative, this is utopian. In a feminist academic context there has been utopian imagination. When Christine de Pizan wrote "Le Livre de la Cité des Femmes" (engl. "The book of the city of women") in 1405 she created a milestone for feminist utopias, long before Thomas More established the literary genre of the utopia with his famous novel Utopia in 1516. Momentous for feminist utopias was Pizane's decision that female happiness can only be established without men. During the first wave of feminism in the 19th and early 20th century, Charlotte Perkins Gilman, a women's right activist took a chance on the utopian genre and wrote "Herland" (1915), about an all-female society which is able to reproduce via parthenogenesis and became herewith a leading figure for further feminist writers of utopia. During second-wave feminism (1960-1970's) most feminist utopias concentrated on protecting this perfectly equal society, as in Marge Piercy's "Woman on the Edge of Time" (1976). It was during the third wave of feminism that this model was questioned in feminist utopian fiction and the genre critical utopia emerged. These days, the genre of the critical utopia has grown quiet. Inequality between the sexes and the oppression of women is no longer seen as the reason for the world going wrong. It is claimed that we have reached the period of post-feminism. Feminism is dead, unfashionable and useless as equality is achieved, therefore there's no need for a feminist utopia. What should we imagine if there is no desirable alternative or no alternative at all?

Fortunately, few but strong female writers refute those assumptions. Nicaraguan author and declared feminist Gioconda Belli published *El País de las Mujeres* (engl. *A Women's Country*). [...]

Latinoamérica con voz de mujer

Valeria Lafita Fernández 2015 En esta tesis se realiza un análisis interdisciplinar de cuatro novelas de la escritora nicaragüense Gioconda Belli: *El país bajo mi piel*, *Waslala*, *El país de las mujeres* y *La mujer habitada*. Por eso, se indaga en las raíces profundas de la pérdida identitaria del territorio, en la mirada fundacional y colonialista a partir de la cual se observa a sí mismo el sujeto latinoamericano, en la necesidad imperiosa de repensarse en medio de un territorio convulso y desde una posición periférica en relación al orden mundial, en la transgresión y creación de utopías como única forma de construirse. Asimismo, se pretende dar una respuesta desde el género al problema de la identidad, una respuesta desde la mujer, uniendo lo femenino a la naturaleza, a la lucha ancestral del pueblo contra todo tipo de opresión y vinculando a la mujer con la cultura tradicional perdida, con la propia tierra latinoamericana, con la Pacha. De esta manera, se brinda una respuesta desde el género y desde un lugar periférico al problema de la identidad, creando la visión de un sujeto femenino múltiple, diverso,

permeable, mestizo, generador de vida y centro del cambio, de la resistencia y la utopía. El espacio periférico, ese lugar olvidado y marginalizado por las grandes metrópolis, se convierte, en estas obras, en el motor del cambio, porque es allí donde se encuentran las herramientas y las fuerzas para gestar esa transformación. Y es la mujer latinoamericana, como sujeto doblemente marginal (por su posición subalterna con respecto al poder que ejercen las metrópolis y por su lugar con respecto al poder masculino), la encargada de llevar a cabo la construcción de una nueva identidad nacional y mestiza para el territorio.
